



Principal's Report 6 November 2013

- We are getting closer to a positive resolution in regards to Samsung and the student's slates. We have completed a series of meetings and provided Samsung with a host of data and figures and are now awaiting the final response. It seems very likely that they will release us from the contract and the lease arrangements so that we are able to collect and return the current devices and look to organise a new device for 2014. Subject to the success of this at this stage we are looking to purchase class sets of devices for 2014 and test their specifications, capabilities and robustness in an educational environment. Parents would no longer be charged for the devices in 2014. Subject to a positive result we would look to re-introduce a 1:1 model on a 24/7 basis for senior school students. This would mean these students would look at returning to the model in 2015.
- The sports carnival was a very successful and exciting day. The staff were well organised and the students behaved and performed magnificently. The participation rates were extraordinary and our attendance for the day was 90%. A great result.
- We have completed most of our recruitment processes and are very excited to have this new group of teachers and administrators join the Baldivis Secondary College family in 2014. They are a very keen and committed group!
- Just received word today that one of our students who entered the Premier's ANZAC Student Tour 2014 process has been successful in getting to the final 22 from a total of 445 applications. This is a great achievement. She will now present to a panel and hopefully will be selected as one of the 10 students representing Western Australia.
- Our immersion program has commenced and is going 'gangbusters'! We have our 3 partner primary schools rostered to spend a week at the college and blending a combination of their primary school classes and teachers together with classes in a secondary context and specialised areas. Makybe Rise PS is currently here this week and the Year 6 and 7 students are enjoying a great experience. Well done to the staff involved (many) and special thanks to Alison for her organisation of the initiative.
