Confidence in the classroom

Classroom Management Strategies (CMS) aims to grow professional teaching practice in ways that improve the engagement, learning and well-being of all students. Delivery focuses on using evidence based interactive instructional strategies that increase students' active participation and classroom engagement, leading to better outcomes for students and schools.

Instructional Strategies for Engagement


CMS Instructional Strategies for Engagement provides skills-based professional learning in instructional skills focusing on:

- increasing awareness and comprehension of a range of instructional skills and strategies available to classroom teachers and their impact on student outcomes
- increasing the capacity and confidence of classroom teachers to select, apply and evaluate appropriate instructional skills and strategies as a tool to engage students in learning
- recognising that creating a consistent, positive, engaging classroom includes effective classroom management skills, and is paramount to the successful integration of instructional strategies into the classroom
- developing reflective practices both within workshops and through conferencing in the classroom to support transfer to classroom teaching.

Workshop content includes:

- analysing and applying to the classroom a broad repertoire of instructional strategies and skills including effective feedback, graphic organisers, concept attainment and cooperative learning
- unpacking Johnson's five elements of cooperative learning and applying these to cooperative learning tasks to increase student engagement
- investigating the nature of explicit teaching
- understanding the phases of small group work and their impact on classroom dynamics
- investigating and applying skills of active participation to encourage greater student engagement in learning
- designing cognitively challenging tasks which engage students in work of high quality
- providing a framework to support change in instructional practice.





The professional learning model

Teachers participating in professional learning will attend three one-day workshops at a central location and will participate in three conferences based on classroom observations.

Teacher Consultants will observe and lead a reflective process based on observations and skills presented at the previous workshop. Teachers will require approximately 30 minutes outside of their classrooms to engage in this process. Teachers must complete day one of the workshop series prior to participating in the remaining workshops.

The financial commitment from schools is to cover costs related to:

- teacher relief (where applicable) for their participating staff to attend workshops and for teacher relief to facilitate classroom conferencing
- travel and accommodation where applicable.

CMS covers the costs related to the provision of a consultant, materials and catering.
